

RYAN WALTER

Ryan Walter played more than 1000 games over 15 seasons in the National Hockey League. Drafted second overall by the Washington Capitals, Ryan was named the youngest NHL captain in his second of 4 seasons, played 9 seasons and won a Stanley Cup with the Montreal Canadiens, and returned to his hometown to play his last 2 seasons for the Vancouver Canucks.

He was named Team Canada Captain in the World Junior Tournament, was selected to play in the NHL All-Star game and for Team Canada in 3 World Championships, became a Vice-President of the National Hockey League Players Association, and was honoured as NHL Man of the Year. Ryan has been inducted into the BC Hockey Hall of Fame, the Burnaby Sports Hall of Fame, named to the 30 all-time Washington Capitals' Dream team, the top 50 all-time BCHL players, the top 125 WHL players of all time, and the top 100 Montreal Canadiens in 100 years.

Ryan has a Master of Arts Degree in Leadership/Business. He is the author of 5 books and an expert contributor to magazines, newspapers, radio, and television. Ryan serves as a Director of the Spartan Foundation, and is a member of the Seton



all University Stillman School of Business Leadership Advisory Council, and is the recipient of the TEC Canada Speaker of the Year Award. Ryan won a Gold Medal as Head Coach of Canada's National Women's Hockey Team, was Assistant Coach of the Vancouver Canucks, co-founder, and president of two start-up companies, a TV and radio hockey analyst, a hockey adviser and actor for both television and movies, the creator of a board game, and the President of a professional hockey team. Ryan continues to inspire leaders, teams, businesses, and organizations across North America and beyond, to become their very best.





Krista currently serves Fellowship Pacific churches in Next-Gen Leader Development and Special Projects. She also works with young leaders and pastors by managing Immerse, the in-church contextualized theologically grounded leadership education program that offers a Master of Arts in Biblical Leadership and a Master of Divinity through Northwest Seminary. May Brown

Leader in sport and outdoor recreation, May Brown made significant contributions to the University of British Columbia and Canada over a career spanning more than 60 years. Brown taught physical education at University of British Columbia from 1947 until 1955, and went on to earn her Master of Physical Education in 1961. As the coach of the women's field hockey team, she instilled a sense of team loyalty and accountability that continues to the present day. In her honour, UBC created the May Brown Trophy for the graduating female athlete of the year.

During her life, May was able to recognize and seize opportunities presented to her, and along with her inherited strength of character she forged her own path for nine decades.

In 2000, Brown received a UBC Alumni Achievement Award, and was inducted into the UBC Sports Hall of Fame in 2007 for her contributions to the sport of field hockey. She was recognized for her ability to motivate her players earning their respect and admiration. Brown maintained a strong connection to UBC athletics, serving as member of the UBC Sports Hall of Fame Selection Committee and UBC Athletics Council, and through ongoing support of the Big Block Club and women's field hockey team.

Brown also had a distinguished political career; she was motivated to join politics in part by the poor state of Vancouver's playing fields. She was elected to the Vancouver Park Board and served as city councillor for ten years. Her love of the outdoors and physical activity drew her to appointments on board of directors of the YWCA, the Canadian Camping Association, the National Advisory Council of Fitness and Amateur Sport, and the Victoria Commonwealth Games Society. During the 1960s and '70s May and her husband Lorne established and operated Camp Deka Boys Camp in the Cariboo District of B.C., providing a wilderness camp program that influenced the lives of many boys and young men. In 1986, she was appointed to Member of the Order of Canada. In 1993, Brown was inducted into the Order of British Columbia for her model community involvement, "her contributions over the years, in teaching, physical education, sports and public service are a matter of record to British Columbia."
